This time there will be clergy from Southwark, Bergen (Bjørgvin) Norway, Newcastle (UK) and Møre (Norway) and they will join with students studying for ministry at the NLA University College.

The course provides deep theoretical and methodological insight into what it means to lead change and growth in local congregations, drawing on the experiences of the clergy in both contexts.

The clergy from Southwark who attended the course in 2019 found huge benefits for their ministries.

### Have you heard of the Bishop's Advisory Group for Liturgy?

The group (known as the BAGL) was set up six years ago to study, discuss and advise the Bishop on topics relating to liturgical practice in Southwark. In so doing it hopes to serve the whole Diocese, and the wider church.

It has a dozen members, lay and ordained, reflecting the range of worship styles that enrich the Diocese. Liturgy is understood literally, as a compound of two Greek roots: *ho laos*, the crowd or people; to *ergon*, work. Liturgy is 'people work': what we do together when we gather for prayer and worship.

Besides advising on technical questions, the group has composed liturgy for different occasions, including prayers for Creationtide, responses to COVID, and material for re-opening churches. ### Bishop Rosemarie writes...

'The end of January in the Christian calendar mops up the last vestiges of the Christmas and Epiphany Season, and after the service of Candlemas, in some churches the figures from the Christmas tableau will finally be packed away. Our gaze then moves from the crib to the cross, as the journey from Christmas joins with the journey towards Easter. Before we get there however, there are a few weeks of what is euphemistically called ordinary time.

That word ordinary was much in my mind on January 27 as we commemorated the ordinary people who were very much a part of the extraordinary horrors of the Shoah, the genocidal murder of over 6 million lewish people and millions of others ordinary people deemed subhuman by the Nazi power regime. Sometimes when we review extraordinary events from the perspective of history, we too easily forget that those involved, both victims and perpetrators, were ordinarily people for the most - just like us.

ordinary time, a number of events will take place, some so taken for granted we often overlook their effect on us and the world around and others much more extraordinary and impactful. The days will slowly brighten, the news buds of spring will break forth, the birdsong more voluble as they return from foreign climes. New ministries, lay and ordained, will begin in our churches, and in the Kingston Area, as the new bishop of Kingston, Bishop Martin, will be consecrated on Candlemas day. Gold will give way to green, and then to purple as we move towards Lent. We will once again hear the call to ordinary people, fisherfolk, tax collectors and sinners, to follow the God made manifest in Christ, on the road and to the cross.

But all that is yet to come, and for now, we enter February still looking to the light that has come to lighten the gentiles "A glory dawns in every dark place, the light of Christ, the fullness of grace".
