Bishop Rosemarie writes...

June by John Updike The sun is rich. And gladly pays. In golden hours, Silver days

It feels like summer is on the way, as we come to the end of May. Days are much longer, lighter, and finally, it's definitely warmer. And that warmth is penetrating through the stonework of some of our older churches also, which thankfully means no need for a choice between expensive heating or freezing congregants.

The Church has celebrated its Pentecost birthday, many churches having joined in with praying with a worldwide Christian family for God's Kingdom here on earth to come. And in June we will be reflecting on and participating in the many ways we wish to build that kingdom here on earth. World Environment Day is celebrated annually on 5 June and encourages awareness and action for the protection of the environment. The Diocese is working hard on its eco-church credentials, and it heartening to see how many churches and schools are achieving their bronze and silver awards. The Great Big Green Week, 10 - 18 June is the UK's biggest-ever celebration of community action to tackle climate change and to protect nature, and our churches are also working to care for and treasure god's wonderful creation. Do look out for what is happening in your local community.

Church leaders also understand the way in which the climate crisis, along with other push factors such as war and poverty, is fueling increasing levels of migration, as said by Archbishop Justin Welby in his first intervention during a House of Lords debate on the draft Immigration Bill. It is sad to acknowledge that the number of refugees across the world

is at its highest level ever, the number of people forcibly displaced is now 103 million, and over 32.5 million refugees. Refugee Week is at the end of June and marks the contributions, creativity and resilience of refugees and people seeking sanctuary. Again, churches across our Diocese are engaged in supporting refugees in a variety of ways, as the work to both tend to the needs of others and campaign for compassionate care and better treatment of those who are seeking sanctuary.

Finally, Petertide at the end of June is one of two major traditional periods for the ordination of new deacons and priests, and I will be looking forward to the services in the Cathedral and in the Croydon Area, as we welcome and ordain those pledging to serve God and his Church, his people ad his world.

And finally, a poem by *Malcolm Guite* reflects the wonder of serving God in the life of John the Baptist.

Midsummer night, and bonfires on the hill Burn for the man who makes way for the Light: 'He must increase, and I diminish still, Until his sun illuminates my night.'
So, John the Baptist pioneers our path, Unfolds the essence of the life of prayer, Unlatches the last doorway into faith, And makes one inner space everywhere. Least of the new and greatest of the old, Orpheus on the threshold with his lyre, He sets himself aside, and cries "Behold. The One who stands amongst you comes with fire!"

So, keep his fires burning through this night, Beacons and gateways for the child of light.
